

Afternoon Tea

The Management desires to draw the attention of their Patrons to the Special Service of Afternoon Tea, at an inclusive charge of One Shilling, which will be served at Matinées in the Foyer and at the back of the Stalls during the interval.

To facilitate service, Patrons are requested to kindly order their tea, and book tables for same, from the Attendants in advance.

In accordance with the requirements of the London County Council:—

- (a) The public may leave at the end of the Performance by all exit and entrance doors, and such doors must at that time be open.
- (b) All gangways, passages, and staircases must be kept entirely free from Chairs or any other obstructions
- (c) Persons must not be permitted to stand or sit in any of the intersecting gangways, and of standing be permitted in the gangways at the sides and rear of the seating, sufficient space must be left for persons to pass easily to and fro.
- (d) The safety-curtain must be lowered about the middle of the performance so as to ensure its being in proper working order.
